Lake Scugog Enhancement Project – Public Open House


Lake Scugog Enhancement Project (LSEP) is an environmental and recreational improvement project for Port Perry Bay that benefits the whole lake. The range of benefits is broad including environmental, social, economic, tourism and recreation.

Road Construction Season Begins

With the arrival of warmer weather and the lifting of load restrictions on Township roads, construction season is now here. The Township continues to increase our investment in roads through a 3% special levy, efficiencies and grants. The average investment in our roads has increased to \$5 million per year which is a 63% increase from the average 5

years ago. While we are starting to see an improvement in road conditions across the Township, we still have a long way to go.

The Township is undertaking the following construction projects in 2023:

- Balsam Street reconstruction (Old Simcoe Road to Rosa Street)
- Devitts Road rehabilitation (Cartwright East ¼ Line to Manvers Scugog Townline Road)
- Jobb Road bridge replacement
- 25 km of gravel road resurfaced
- Ashburn Road preventative treatment
- Sidewalk replacements



Spring Operations

Our Public Works crews are now focusing on spring operations that include patching potholes, roadway sweeping, culvert replacements and grading of gravel roads. Gravel road resurfacing and dust suppression will begin in June.

New Pedestrian Crossovers

Pedestrian crossovers are a new way for pedestrians to cross roads easily and safely. The new Pedestrian crossovers on Simcoe Street and Old Simcoe Road have flashing lights, ladder-style stripes and yield bars showing where drivers must stop.

How to use Pedestrian Crossovers:

<u>Pedestrians</u>

- Push the button to activate the flashing lights
- Look both ways
- Make eye contact with drivers to make sure that they see you
- Wait until vehicles stop before entering the road
- Only cross when it is safe to do so

Drivers

- Be aware of the locations of pedestrian crossings
- Watch for pedestrians and flashing lights
- Come to a complete stop when pedestrians are crossing and/or lights are flashing
- Remain stopped until pedestrians have finished crossing the road
- Proceed with caution

Cyclists

- When crossing with pedestrians dismount your bike and walk across the road
- When riding through a crossover follow the same rules as drivers
