Road Closure– Reach Street (west of Hwy. 12)

The Regional Municipality of Durham will be repairing the Nonquon River Bridge, which connects Reach Street (Regional Road 8) over the Nonquon River, in the Township of Scugog. Work started November 16, 2020 and includes replacement of the timber bridge deck and asphalt wearing surface. The bridge will be closed to traffic, with detours in place for approximately 4 weeks while the repair is completed. Visit durham.ca for updates.

Notice of Road Construction Hwy. 7A (Manchester) Eastbound Lane Closed Detour In Place

Road construction is underway by the Ministry of Transportation (MTO) on Hwy. 7A, 200 metres east of Hwy. 7/12 in Manchester. The construction is scheduled to start November 24 and the eastbound lane will reopen on December 4, 2020.

The construction work will close the eastbound lane on Highway 7A at the culvert location. Highway 7A westbound

traffic will remain unaffected, with one lane of traffic maintained as per existing conditions. Due to the closure, a detour will be implemented. Sidewalk access will be provided on one side of the road to maintain pedestrian traffic.

Winter By-law Reminders

Winter weather is on its way and the Township wants to remind residents:

- Overnight parking is not permitted on Township roads starting November 1 until April 15, whether there is snow on the ground or not. Vehicles parked on the roads or shoulder between 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. will be subject to a \$30 fine and may be towed at the owner's expense. Scugog (Durham) Moves to Red - Control Level for COVID-19

On Monday, November 23, 2020, the Province of Ontario moved Durham Region Public Health Unit from level Orange to Red – Control. The Township of Scugog follows the guidelines

and recommendations of Durham Region Public Health and the province of Ontario and will be taking further steps to support the government's efforts to curtail the spread of COVID-19.

The Red – Control Level provides additional restrictions and tightening up of numbers in many workplace and business facilities including fitness, recreation and restaurant areas. Township of Scugog has upgraded their protocols and restrictions to include updated health measures. Below are highlights of what you can expect at Scugog facilities.

Municipal Office (181 Perry Street) and Fire Administration (30 Crandell Street)

- Effective Monday, November 23 all front counter services are available by appointment only. Please email or phone the department contact to make arrangements
- Visitors who have an appointment must answer a COVID-19 screening questionnaire and sign-in
- Staff undergo daily self-assessment for COVID-19
- Drop-box and online payment options remain available
- Maintain a 2 metre physical distance, wear mask or face covering and use of hand sanitizer are mandatory
- Lobby washrooms remain closed

Scugog Community Recreation Centre - Effective immediately

- Modified recreation programs are available and staff undergo daily self-assessment for COVID-19
- Arenas and Daytime public skating are limited to 10 people per pad, dressing rooms are closed
- Team sports must not be practiced or played except for training (no games or scrimmages)
- Daytime Shinny and scrimmage programs cancelled

- Pickleball games are not permitted
- No spectators permitted except for one parent/guardian to supervise a child
- No person may enter the Scugog Community Recreation Centre without a reservation. All individual program participants will need to register online including skate programs, walking program and the Lookout Youth Centre
- Increased spacing between patrons to 3 metres for areas of sport or recreation where there are exercise/fitness classes
- Community Centre programs restricted to 10 participants plus instructor Fitness classes limited to 10 people per room
- Recreation Room restricted to 8 participants plus instructor
- Recreation lobby – 8 patrons
- Maintain physical distance and masks must be worn in the facility or in the Lookout Youth Centre except while engaging in a fitness activity

We all have to do our part as we continue to fight the spread of COVID-19. Public Health advises to restrict non-essential travel from areas of high-transmission to areas of low-transmission. Residents and business owners are reminded to remain vigilant with maintaining protocols, following limits for gatherings, keep a 2 metre (6 foot) distance between yourself and others, always wear a mask or face covering and wash your hands often.
