

Bob Carnegie

ATHLETE

Born and raised in Port Perry, Bob was a standout multi-sport athlete excelling in hockey and lacrosse. Bob played minor hockey in Port Perry before continuing his Junior hockey with the Brooklin Combine team in 1955-56. Playing alongside fellow Port Perry teammates, Bill Cornish and Garnet Warriner the team won the OHA Junior 'D' Championship in 1956.



In the summer of 1956 Bob was encouraged by some of his hockey friends to try-out for lacrosse with the Brooklin Lacrosse Club. His athletic talents were rewarded when he made the team. Again, playing with teammate, Garnet Warriner, the team won the Ontario Intermediate 'C' Championship in 1957 and Bob's 1958 team won the Intermediate 'B' Championship.

In his last year of Junior in the 1959/1960 season, Bob played for the Whitby Red Wings lacrosse team and he and his teammates won the Ontario and Eastern Canada Junior 'A' championships and finished second in the Canadian Minto Cup in New Westminster BC.

Bob went on to win multiple Ontario championships playing lacrosse in the summer while attending Queen's University. He competed in Senior 'A' lacrosse and won three OLA (Ontario Lacrosse Association) championships from 1961 to 1963.

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In addition to his successful lacrosse playing career, Bob coached the Men's hockey team at Queens University from 1963 -1976. He coached the Women's hockey team at Queens from 1963 - 1965. Bob enjoyed 35 years as a Physical Education faculty member at Queens University from 1962 – 1997, retiring as an Associate Professor and Director of Athletics.

As a competitive athlete and dedicated coach, the Scugog Sports Hall of Fame welcomes Bob back to his hometown to be included as part of the Inductee class of 2023.
